

SUNDAY'S READING: WORSHIP BOOK #1117

Green is the color of Ordinary Time. This color symbolizes life, hope, and anticipation. **Pope Francis has designated 2025 a year of Jubilee with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope."** A Jubilee happens every 25 years and has its origins in Chapter 25 of the Book of Leviticus as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home. 2025's theme was chosen to help restore hope, trust, and to care for the common home.



JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. Their embrace indicates the solidarity which should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross, a sign of the faith and also of hope, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need. The rough waves under the figures symbolize that life's journey does not always go smoothly in calm waters and requires a greater call to hope. The lower part of the cross has been elongated into the shape of an anchor, a wellknown symbol of hope. The cross in the logo is dynamic bending down towards humanity, not leaving humans alone, but offering the certainty of its presence and the security of hope.

Located on the second floor of the Parish Life Center, the library is well-stocked with a wide array of resources suitable for children, parents, and seniors, along with an extensive selection of theological works. We also have a St. Anthony Parish history section that has materials about our parish throughout its 100 + year history.

Our children's section is extensive, featuring resources for parents, books that educate children about living a Catholic life, as well as topics on the Saints, Bible stories, sacraments, death, divorce, bullying, mental health and teenage issues. Feel free to bring your children with you — the library provides games to keep them engaged while you enjoy your reading. It's also equipped with children's toys, coloring books, and even a tipi for reading.
